Temporary Fire Department Changes During Upgrades

he Fire Department Fire Station Project is officially underway! The project includes upgrades to both the John B. Glaser Fire Station Headquarters at 6501 Quivira Road and Fire Station 73 at 6805 Hedge Lane Terrace.

Please note we have temporarily relocated administrative services and staff to a space inside in the PBI-Gordon building at 22701 West 68th Terrace. This is a secured building, if you need to visit in person, you can park on the north side of the building where you can get buzzed in. If you are stopping in between 4:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m., you will need to call 631-1080 to be let in.

While renovations are happening at Fire Station 73, you can rest assured we will still have full coverage for emergency responses. Station 74 will cover the north end of that coverage area and Lenexa will cover the south end while improvements are underway.

If you are looking for a burn permit, you can get that online at cityofshawnee.org/fire. You can find project updates at cityofshawnee.org/firestationproject.

We anticipate this temporary relocation to last through mid-2024 while work is happening at Fire Headquarters.

Curbside Bulky-Item Pick Up

- The City regulates trash haulers to offer free curbside bulky-item pick up once a year.
- Most residents can schedule bulky-item pick up directly with their trash hauler. Some residents will have specific days during the year for pick up. Contact your trash hauler to learn their plans.
- If you live in an HOA or rental property your HOA board/president or property manager may schedule specific days during the year for pick up. Contact them to learn if they have specific plans.
- Residents are allowed FIVE ITEMS for their curbside pickup.
- Some acceptable items are listed below and at cityofshawnee.org/tidytown. Check with your trash hauler to make sure their guidelines have not changed.
 - **Furniture**
 - **Mattresses**
 - Most appliances except for refrigerators

Tidy Town Voucher

Johnson County Landfill (17955 Holliday Drive)

Monday - Friday 7am to 5pm Saturday 7am to 3pm

- The City offers one voucher to each residential address to be used at the Johnson County Landfill.
- The drop-off site is at the Johnson County Landfill at 17955 Holliday Drive.
- You MUST bring the voucher and proof of residency with you to redeem at the landfill by December 31, 2023.
- Residents can take a variety of items to the landfill, including furniture and mattresses.
- One drop-off per voucher at the landfill allowed per year.

Weekly monitoring between March and August is required and no experience is needed. Volunteers must be 16 or older unless accompanied by an adult.





Use these tips to avoid falling victim to phone, e-mail or door-to-door scams. If you are the victim of a scam or believe you saw a scam attempt, report it to the Federal Trade Commission at www.ReportFraud.ftc.gov or call 877-382-4357.

Phone Scams

Avoid answering the phone if you do not recognize the number. Be cautious with Caller ID. Scammers can change the number on your Caller ID screen so the number looks familiar.

E-mail Scams

Avoid clicking any links or downloading attachments. Scammers can design their e-mail to look legitimate, but the links may be harmful.

Never provide any personal information via e-mail, including banking information, passwords and personal identification.

Door-to-Door Scams

Never let an unexpected stranger into your home. Always ask for identification and confirm with the company before letting anyone onto your property. Monitor workers in your yard and home.

St rmwater Snapshot

Floods are one of the most common disasters in the United States. Be aware of flood risks in your area and pay close attention to flood watches and warnings. You can do several things to cut down your flood risk.

- Improve grading on your property to make sure stormwater runs away from your home
- Routinely clean debris out of gutters and ditches
- Create natural green spaces
- Install a sump pump
- Keep any valuable items and documents in a safe location off the floor
- Never walk or drive through flood waters. Turn around, don't drown!
- Talk to your insurance agent about flood insurance.
